Thank you: Dear Parishioners of St George's, Warminster, Thank you! Your generous gift of bags of rice (115kg) is giving hope to asylum seekers and refugees in Bristol, showing them that they are welcome and supported by the wider community. Our food bank is accessed by around 25 individuals each week, many of whom are themselves supporting children or dependent adults. Your gift of rice helps us ensure there is plenty to go around, and that no one goes home empty handed. It's so lovely to know that there are communities supporting our members from a distance. Since I last wrote to you, we have seen more than 500 individuals, all of whom come to our centre because of the harsh conditions created for those without secure immigration status. Thank you for being part of resisting this hostility and extending welcome to those fleeing persecution and looking for sanctuary.
