Year of Prayer: There is a simple message in today's Gospel warning us to be wary of placing too much emphasis on acquiring more and more possessions. Very often wealth is seen as a marker of who we are in the eyes of the world. Yes, wealth can enable us to have a decent house, allow our children to go to the right school, enjoy holidays and much more. We can be proud of what we achieve as the rich man is in our parable. But in whose eyes are we rich? Rich in the sight of the world or rich in the sight of God? It's a struggle for us. The Church encourages us to 'live simply' with integrity and humility. Living by these values allows us to depend on our inner resources. They allow us to recognise that all we have is gift given to us, not to hold onto for ourselves, but to share with the world for the good of the world, so that all may benefit. This is what matters. At the moment of our calling from this world we will be judged not by how much we have but how much we have loved.

Permanent Deacons: One of the first Permanent Deacons in our Diocese, Deacon Wallis Hardy, was ordained at St George's on Whit Sunday 1976 and served in the parish for six years until he retired in his eightieth year. The Permanent Diaconate is open to either single men over 35 who feel called to the celibate life or to married men over 40. Those who are married must have the support of their wife and family. Any candidate must demonstrate the necessary maturity and stability for this life-long commitment. They will be prepared to embark on a four year part-time course of formation. Most candidates will be in the world of work and continue to be so after ordination. Indeed it is the role of the Permanent Deacon to have "one foot in the sanctuary and the other in the workplace". Above all, they will be men of faith and prayer, with a desire to serve others for the sake of God's kingdom.
