Year of Communion: Spiritual writer, Henri Nowen, tells the story of an old man who, noticing a scorpion caught in the tangled roots of a tree, stretches out and tries to free the scorpion. The scorpion reacts by stinging his hand. He recoils in pain but tries once more. He continues to do this while his hand grows more and more bloody and swollen. A passer-by sees what is happening and laughs, shouting across to him, 'Silly old man, don't you know it is the nature of the scorpion to sting. That ugly creature will kill you if you keep on.' The old man stares back at him and replies, 'Just because it is the nature of the scorpion to kill, why should I give up my nature to save?' The all-consuming compassion and love of Jesus is reflected in this story. The death of Jesus was the ultimate act of sacrifice to save us. Through the very bloody and inhumane suffering of one man, we have been given life. Today is a day to glorify the Lord and to be with him in his pain, so that we may also share in his victory.
