Year of Communion: One of the most notable elements of the London Olympics and Paralympics was not the number of medals that were won by the athletes but the way they received them. In interview after interview the athletes showed their deep desire to highlight the role that others had played in their success. Particularly striking was how many of the athletes thanked God, first and foremost, and then all those who had supported them along the way. There was a humility and gratitude about them that seemed to run to the core of their being. In the Gospel Jesus giving thanks for those who are humble enough to hear the word of God and respond with humility, like little children. The athletes at the Olympics were full of pride, but it was a pride rooted in the knowledge that they did not do this alone. Their pride in winning was rooted in a humble acceptance that God had been with them throughout.

Church Opening for Private Prayer: The Church will be open on Wednesday 24 June from 10.30am to 12.30pm and on Friday 26 from 1.30pm to 9.30pm with Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Please note the following conditions:

- Whilst care has been taken by the Church to follow the guidelines as set by the Diocese/The Bishop's Conference, we cannot eliminate all risk. If you are within the Vulnerable Category, it remains your own choice to come to church for individual private prayer.
- Please do not visit the church if you or someone in your house has a high temperature, a new / continuous cough or loss/change from normal sense of smell or taste, or have a cold or flu-like symptoms.
- Volunteers will be present to supervise, to guide and ensure that only safe numbers are present and social distancing is maintained at all times. Initially, no more than 7 pews will be available in the church at any one time.
- Face coverings: The Government have advised that cloth face coverings (not surgical masks) could be worn for reassurance by people in enclosed spaces. For the safety and convenience of others, we recommend you wear a face covering.
- If the safe number for the church has been reached you will be asked to wait outside at a safe distance until a space is available.
- Please use the hand sanitiser before proceeding into the church
- When you are in the church please continue to observe social distancing (2 metres). Do not use any pews that are cordoned off or are already occupied. People from the same household may sit together.
- If accompanied by children, parents must manage them appropriately, particularly ensuring they touch as few surfaces as possible, for their own safety and the safety of others.
- It will be possible for you to light a candle in front of the Lady Altar, but only from an already lit candle. Please wait at 2 metre distance if someone is in front of you.
- There is no time limit to how long you may stay other than the end time for the session, but please be aware of others who may be waiting to come in.
- Please do not touch or physically venerate any statues.
- Please do not gather outside the church after you leave.
- Please note there will be no toilet facilities available.
