Dear Parishioners of St George's, Warminster,

We are so grateful for your continued support to Borderlands, particularly as the coronavirus pandemic drags on and on. This has been a particularly difficult time for asylum seekers and other migrants in Bristol, as their usual sources of support have stopped face-to-face services, and many have lost accommodation due to anxiety about contagion.

Your generous donation of rice has helped us continue offering a weekly food distribution, by collection and delivery. Since the lockdown began on the 23rd of March, we have packed and distributed 3,304 bags of food, and offered a hot take-away meal each week. We have had 826 attendances in the same time period by 162 individuals. These people are collecting food for their families at home, and this number does not include the 88 individuals we have been supporting by delivery. Thank you for helping us to continue offering solidarity and support to our members at a time of crisis.
