STEP 4 GUIDANCE FOR COMMUNAL WORSHIP DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC :

In light of the recent Government Announcement we have received Guidance from the Bishops Conference of England and Wales. Caution, common sense and sensitivity towards others are watchwords along with careful appraisal of the risk levels in our area. In the interests of safety, sensitively towards the concerns of many parishioners and time to accurately assess all implications we have taken the view that we will continue with no substantial changes for the time being. That is, we will: Encourage everyone to continue wearing a mask in our church. Maintain social distancing Continue with hand and bench sanitising Continue the practice of good ventilation in our church. We will consider revised guidance to the parish at the end of August
